The challenge of xenophobia was the focus of two events hosted by the Inclusive Society Institute (ISI) during the past month. The first was a virtual workshop hosted in partnership with the Centre for Leadership Ethics in Africa (CLEA) on 4 August, and the second was a roundtable held on 17 August.

South Africa is part of a global community, where migration is a natural occurrence. How the country manages its resources in this context becomes very important, considering the current economic climate. It is therefore not surprising that xenophobia is so topical at the moment.

Electoral reform remains another hot topic as we approach the elective conference of the ANC in December this year and the National and Provincial Elections in 2024. We continue to focus on this issue and had a discussion with the Minister of Home Affairs in this regard. With less than two years to go till the next elections this is an urgent matter.

I am also pleased that our international work received attention during this period. Among others, the ISI participated in a panel discussion on UN reform which was organised by the Communications Directorate of Türkiye's Presidency.

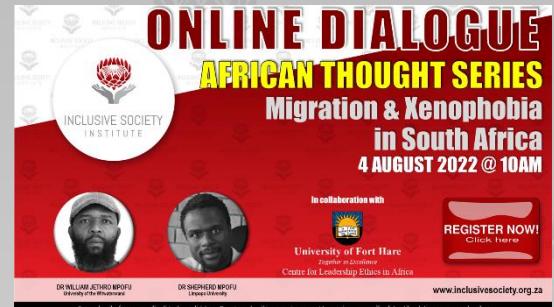
